

Advice from The Frinton Residents' Association

Your assistance in helping to ensure that neither horses, nor their riders, or pedestrians are put at risk, would be much appreciated.

The Tendring District Council Byelaws are displayed on the notice board outside the public toilets on The Greensward at the bottom of Connaught Avenue. These include:

Horse Riding is not allowed on The Greensward or the Promenade.

Please do not use the public footpaths to reach the beach, as these are often narrow, steep, winding, and dangerous not only for horses and their riders, but also for those pedestrians who meet horses coming down these paths.

There is an adequate way down to the beach, it is a thoroughfare with stumps either side, opposite the bottom of Third Avenue, and this leads to a ramp that gives direct access to the beach.

Whilst we do not want to deter you from riding horses on the beach when there are few people using it, please avoid doing so when it is crowded.

The beach and Greensward areas are very popular and people may not realise that some of their activities are frightening to horses (e.g. push kiters, remote toys, drones etc.) so please be aware.
